
Fundraising in Frankenmuth for Branch Lutheran Schools of Haiti

Dear Members and Friends of the Evangelical Lutheran Synod,

Greetings in the name of the One whose blood covers us cleansing us from all our sin so that we are blessed in our living and our dying!

By some estimates the 20th century was the bloodiest of all the centuries of human history: a quarter of a billion people, military and civilian, were killed on account conflicts. Sadly, wars and rumors of war still persist in the 21st century. But the greatest bloodbath of all time was when the Son of God suffered death for all people of all times. His holy blood was shed so that all would be delivered from sin, death and hell. Peace with God is now secure forever in the blood of His holy Lamb poured out for the sins of the world and thus for you. Consider these words of Dr. Luther and be at peace:

"Baptism is a washing in which we are washed by the blood of the innocent Lamb, Christ. He pays for sin and puts death to death. This power and ability is not found in the pope's Mass, requiem, or pilgrimages, but there is only one innocent Lamb who shed His blood and overcame death; and since it is not in the cowl and tonsure, it is to be sought in Baptism, in the Supper, the Gospel and the Absolution. We are sure that all these things are instituted by God. This is certain and is seasoned and anointed with the innocent blood of Christ. It has the Father, Son and Holy Spirit with His ordinance and Word. It all comes from the merit of Christ. For this reason, the fathers said that all the sacraments flowed from the side of Christ. The blood of Christ flows into Baptism, into the chalice, and Absolution."
